Swansea - City by the Sea

Swansea has a huge amount to offer – our rich heritage, passion for innovation, changing city centre with unprecedented levels of investment and unique quality of life.

The UK's only beachfront City.

At the heart on the city centre the Digital Village will offer flexible, affordable office space with cutting-edge digital communications providing the ideal location for technology and creative businesses with a range of value added amenities.

Many of the city's buildings are being brought back into use in new and imaginative ways, which, when combined with the planned new developments will create **300,000 sq ft** of new office space.

The box village development planned for SA1 Waterfront will offer affordable space for start-up companies, bringing them together with students and academics from University of Wales Trinity Saint David and businesses to share expertise and explore new areas for growth.

Copr Bay - the new 3,500 capacity indoor Digital Arena, the Hafod Copperworks - former site of the world's largest copperworks and Skyline's luge and cable car leisure facility, dramatically overlooking the city centre. These developments will attract tens of thousands of new visitors to the city, along with new spending and supply opportunities for businesses.



Swansea also offers **quality** of life.

An innovative waterfront city at the heart of the wider Swansea Bay City Region. An attractive mix of city working, living and learning set on a sandy five-mile stretch of beautiful coastline.

Home to the UK's first Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, Swansea boasts 32 miles of coastline with over 50 named beaches and coves, offering an array of watersports and outdoor living. Rhossili Bay- Wales' best beach and widely regarded as one of the best beaches in the world; Three Cliffs Bay - recently named the UK's best picnic spot; Mumbles -Sunday Times best place to live in the UK 2018 best in Wales. An estimated 4.79 million people visited Swansea Bay in 2019 spending £477.22 million.

Swansea's city centre is welcoming and vibrant, with a proud heritage and a progressive, modern outlook. A hub of shops, restaurants & bars, galleries, museums, parks and theatres topped off with a lively, purple flag award night-time economy and range of live music venues.

Swansea is the top place in the UK for being friendly, welcoming, and trustworthy and 3rd for happiness (Provident 2018) so any company locating here can be certain of a good quality workforce.

Business & Economic Activity

Over 75% of Swansea's working age population are economically active. The City and County offers employment to 112,000, 88% in service sectors An estimated 33,400 people commute into Swansea each day (2020). Average (median) earnings for full-time employees in Swansea stand at £538.00 per week and £27,480 per year (April 2020).

Key employers in the City

Admiral employs more than 2,000 people across the City and the first South Wales company to be included in the FTSE 100 Index.

Arvato, operating the UK government's first Independent Shared Service Centre located at the Department for Transport (DfT) in Swansea.

BT, the world's most established communications company, a major employer who have expanded their operations in the city, testing new products/services here.

ERS, the only specialist motor insurance syndicate in Lloyds of London, employs over 500 people at its Glass Systems Ltd – leading supplier of sealed glass units

HSBC, one of the world's largest banking and financial services organisations, employing over 1,000 people in Swansea.

TUI continues to expand its travel company base in the heart of the city centre.

Virgin Atlantic, employing over 200 people at its customer service operation in the city centre.

Wolfestone, largest language translation services company in Wales.

Swansea's status as the regional retail, leisure, educational and administrative centre for South West Wales is reflected in the high proportion of employment in the service sectors.

There are over 7,000 active businesses in Swansea and over 21,000 businesses in the wider Swansea Bay city region.

Technology

Swansea is a competitive city with a sophisticated telecommunications network including advanced data and video communications, with access to both superfast and ultrafast broadband connectivity and has been a UK pioneer of new broadband technologies. We were one of the UK's first areas to trial G.Fast ultrafast broadband technologies . BT and Talk Talk now offer our businesses and residents ultrafast broadband speeds in excess of 300Mbps.

Linked to the £1.3bn Swansea Bay City Deal is a digital theme running through key city centre regeneration schemes. City Deal investment is funding a high-speed fibre network around the city centre, creating and connected an array of hi-tech facilities including:

• **Digital Arena** 95,000 sq ft of multifunctional arena and conference space, with a 3,500 capacity. The exterior digital skin will enable internal performances, live streaming and marketing content to be showcased on a large scale. This will allow even larger audiences to engage with cultural content. The global Ambassador Theatre Group has signed a 30 year agreement to operate the arena.

• **Copr Bay** A vibrant, mixed use development that pulls together and enhances the existing elements of the city centre, instrumental in creating a sustainable way forward



• **Digital Village** 114,000 sq ft of flexible, affordable office space with cutting edge digital communications providing grow on space for technology businesses.

Our city centre regeneration programme is predicted to create 2,638 FTE jobs and generate an additional £128m of GVA per annum.

Swansea University's Institute of Life Science co-locates interdisciplinary R&D with state-of-the-art clinical research facilities and business incubation units, supporting the growth of a dynamic life science cluster.

Regeneration Swansea is a local partnership driving forward the economic regeneration of Swansea with a focus on maximising benefits for local people. Membership includes the private sector, local universities and college, third sector and housing associations working together to maximise economic benefits from regeneration projects in order to improve the prosperity of the local area and its people.

In the last year it has endorsed a number of schemes to bring vacant property back into use as commercial and housing opportunities, working with private and public sector developers to maximise the benefits for the local economy.

District centres such as Morriston, Gorseinon and Penllergaer are being targeted as a strategic area for regeneration. Activities such as heritage led regeneration, bringing vacant properties back into use and diversifying the use of high streets whilst working with local business and key employers in a bid to increase footfall.

The large and diverse range of partners is able to support business looking to locate in Swansea, with links to relevant agencies and local business contacts.

The College also offers HNC/HNDs and professional qualifications with close connections to courses at UWTSD University.

Gower College Swansea also runs a full range of apprenticeship and trainee programmes, enabling employers to nurture their own talent whilst developing a motivated, skilled and qualified workforce. The Digital Employers Group ensures the College is tailoring its offer to meet the needs of business.



Swansea's education and business sectors also work closely together to run programmes of enterprise education in Swansea schools, colleges and universities in order to help and support young people in reaching their potential.

96.8% of University of Wales Trinity Saint David's full-time UK undergraduates were in employment and/or further study six months after graduating.
