

MUST-SEE SITES

In Bordeaux, there is a multitude of tours and experiences to enjoy. To make the most of your stay, explore our selection of must-see sites: La Cité du Vin, the historic UNESCO-listed city centre, the Bassins de Lumières, the festive and food-oriented parts of town, the Darwin ecosystem, the right bank of the River Garonne... and much more! If you're staying a little longer, explore the Bordeaux vineyards by taking the five Wine Routes.

To visit the essential sites, have free access to museums and benefit from unlimited use of the tram network- all at a preferential rate- don't forget to pick up a CityPass:  valid for 24, 48 or 72 hours (see page 13).



1 MONUMENT AUX GIRONDINS

A tribute to the inhabitants of Gironde lost during the French Revolution, 'Liberty Breaking its Chains' stands proud at the top of the 43m column (1895-1901).

2 MAISON GOBINEAU

Bordeaux's own version of the 'Flatiron Building' which houses the CIVB headquarters (Bordeaux Wine Multi-Disciplinary Council) as well as their wine bar, which is a local institution (1788).

3 GRAND-THÉÂTRE

A masterpiece of European architecture, the stair of which inspired the architect responsible for the Opera Garnier in Paris. It is fronted by a columned portico with twelve stone statues (9 muses and 3 goddesses (Minerva, Venus, Juno)).

4 ÉGLISE NOTRE-DAME

Constructed by the Dominicans, the church is typical of baroque edifices of the Counter-Reformation. Its parvis has been the set of numerous period-drama films.

5 PORTE DIJEAUX

A gateway into the city from the West since the Roman era, it was rebuilt by Michel Voisin between 1748 and 1753. Under Louis XV, it was called Dauphin's Gate in honour of the French Dauphin, the future King Louis XVI.

6 PALAIS ROHAN

This building was originally the Archbishop's Palace in 1784, but in 1800 it became the Gironde Prefecture, then an imperial palace and royal residence, until finally becoming the city hall in 1837.

7 CATHÉDRALE SAINT-ANDRÉ & TOUR PEY-BERLAND

This Gothic-style cathedral hosted two royal marriages. The first between Eleanor of Aquitaine and the future Louis VII and the second between Anne of Austria and Louis XIII. The Pey Berland Tower, a bell tower built in the 15th century separately from the cathedral, offers a unique view of the city (50m).

8 MUSÉE D'AQUITAINE

A museum retracing the history of Aquitaine and Bordeaux, from prehistory to the present.

9 GROSSE CLOCHE

A historic town belfry and the only remains of the old defensive gate of the 13th century. The weather vane on top represents a golden lion, symbol of the Kings of England. Cast in 1775, the bell weighs 7,800 kg.

10 PLACE FERNAND-LAFARGUE

The former 'old market place' (1155), where the pillory was once installed. Today along with Rue Saint James constitutes one of the hippest places in Bordeaux.

11 PORTE CAILHAU

This defensive structure, built between 1493 and 1496 on the site of an old gatehouse, was the main point of entry into the city from the river for almost two centuries.

12 ÉGLISE SAINT-PIERRE

Built between the 14th and 15th centuries on the site of an old Gallo-Roman port. The square and the paved streets that branch off make up Bordeaux's old town.

13 PLACE DU PARLEMENT

The most Italian of the squares in the city, created in 1754 by decree of Bailiff Tourny. In the centre stands a fountain by Louis Garros (1865).

14 PLACE DE LA BOURSE

This product of the Age of Enlightenment is the most comparable city square to Versailles. Previously called the Royal Square, along with the 'Stock Market Building' it became the place where trade prices were set in the 18th century. The left wing is home to Bordeaux Patrimoine Mondial, a discovery centre that invites the public to discover the city's history throughout the centuries. In the centre of the square lies The Fountain of the Three Graces.

15 MIROIR D'EAU

The key element in the regeneration of the riverside carried out in 2006. It is the largest water mirror in the world (3450 m², plus an 800 m² underground reservoir) and has become the city's emblematic spot where locals and tourists alike love to gather.







BORDEAUX. THE HISTORIC CENTRE

Accompanied by a guide, explore the historic city centre. In 2 hours, visit the city's most remarkable sites, learning about them as you go, as well as part of the city that has been listed as a UNESCO World Heritage site.

Discovering Bordeaux on foot is the best way to experience the city's diversity. The 'City of The Lumières', drawn up with a compass by 18th century architects and town planners, is synonymous with harmony: hôtels particuliers, beautiful squares and avenues are spread all along this route that takes you through picturesque areas like Saint Rémi and Saint Pierre quarters. Some of the winding streets have not changed since the Middle Ages. "Blond stone" is present everywhere, including in the sculpted faces that sit atop the city centre doorways, the mascarons. These stand as remarkable examples of art and masonry.

BENEATH THE MONUMENT AUX GIRONDINS

Explore the eerie crypts underneath the Monument aux Girondins.

Did you know you could enter the monument and visit the crypts, underneath the column? Explore the column's interior structure and the fountains' machinery, as well as the moulds of certain parts of the statues found at the base of the monument. This self-proclaimed 'Monument' was built in memory of the Girondins - a political faction bearing the name of the region, who were among the first victims of The Terror - as well as to celebrate the founding of the French Republic. It consists of gushing bronze fountains and a 41 metre-high column, at the top of which lies a statue that depicts Liberty breaking out of her chains.

MEDIEVAL BORDEAUX

Set off on a discovery of medieval Bordeaux and its alleyways, half-timbered houses, streets whose names conjure trades and buildings from the distant past.

While much of the city's medieval remains were swept away as part of the city's remodelling in the 18th and 19th centuries, traces have been dug up during archeological digs and during the construction of underground car parks. However, several churches and fortifications still remain, such as 'La Grosse Cloche', at the time built as the belfry to the city hall. The memory of Eleanor of Aquitaine lingers over Place du Palais, on the site of what was the residence of the Dukes of Aquitaine, 'Le Palais de l'Ombrière'. The names of the streets, sometimes engraved into the stone, evoke trades that have long since disappeared. You can see the vestiges of a 14th century house with its gothic bay windows at one point, then further along a cul-de-sac that leads you to the foot of the 13th century ramparts. Miraculously spared by the city's urbanisation, a half-timbered house still stands today and astonishes with its rustic architecture.

GUIDED TOUR OF PALAIS ROHAN - HÔTEL DE VILLE DE BORDEAUX

Follow our tour guide as you go behind the scenes of this emblematic monument, built between 1771 and 1784 on the instruction of the Archbishop of Bordeaux, Ferdinand Maximilien Mériadec de Rohan. After the Revolution, it took on the municipal role of city hall that it has today.

Beforehand, the "palace" was the Archbishop's residence, then the seat of the regional authorities and headquarters of the revolutionary tribunal. After more transformations (it was an imperial palace, then a royal palace), Le Palais Rohan became the official City Hall in 1835.

In its location next to the cathedral, Le Palais Rohan is a reminder of the grandeur and power of the archbishops of Bordeaux in the 18th century. Its Louis XVI-style façade conceals one of the most beautiful staircases in all of France, considered as a masterpiece of stonemasonry. You will also explore the palace's remarkable salons, as well as the room where the city council meets, built in 1889 and characteristic of the architecture of the 3rd Republic.



MEDOC 1855.

OUTSTANDING GRANDS CRUS CLASSES

1855 is a magic date for Bordeaux wine lovers, and a special tour has been devised just for them.

Undertaken at the request of Napoléon III and unchanged since 1855, the famous 1855 classification of the wines of Bordeaux officially recognised 86 estates, and divided them into 5 categories (first, second, third, fourth, and fifth growths). These are located in the Médoc, in Sauternes and Barsac, and, one of them (Château Haut-Brion) in the Graves. Fourteen of these great growths, among the most famous in Bordeaux, are welcoming visitors on Wednesday from May to October on a rotating basis.

QUINCONCES, GRANDS HOMMES



Allées de Tourny, Cours de l'Intendance and Cours George Clemenceau form Bordeaux's "golden triangle". This is a local hotspot where everyone runs into each other! The area is famous for its beautiful glass shopping gallery (Galerie des Grands Hommes) and streets adorned with famous names from the literary world. Wine merchants selling Grand Crus and champagne, delicatessens and luxury boutiques compete with the terraces of some fine restaurants. Welcome to the monumental heritage of the French Enlightenment era: the time when these buildings sprung up as part of the redevelopment of the city carried out by Intendants Boucher and Tourny, transforming Bordeaux from medieval to modern.

1 PLACE DES QUINCONCES

Work on this esplanade was carried out between 1810 and 1828 where Château Trompette once stood. It takes its name from the "quinconce" arrangement of the trees on either side. Two rostral columns stand before the river, with their statues that celebrate commerce and seafaring. Further up the square, there are two colossal statues of the Bordeaux philosophers Montaigne and Montesquieu and finally the Monument aux Girondins. This giant column is a tribute to the late Men and Women of Gironde who were lost during the Revolution, it is composed of gushing bronze fountains with its raised column, on top of which stands the statue of 'Liberty Breaking her Chains'.



HISTORY

CHÂTEAU TROMPETTE

Following the Battle of Castillon in 1453, Bordeaux fell under the authority of the kings of France after three centuries of English rule. Charles VII ordered the construction of Château Trompette to assert his authority and protect the city against an English invasion. Between 1664 and 1675, Louis XIV rebuilt the château in the form of a fortified citadel under the supervision of Vauban.

Louis XVI sold it in 1787 before it was destroyed in 1818 to make way for Place des Quinconces.

2 MAISON GOBINEAU, WINE BAR

With its neoclassical decor, works of art and contemporary furnishings, La Maison Gobineau- named after the local parliamentarian Joseph-Thibault Gobineau- takes the form of a ship's bow; it's an ideal spot to stop for a tasting.

3 GRAND THEATRE

This majestic structure, built by Victor Louis under the reign of Louis XVI, is one of the most beautiful concert halls made in the 18th century. The staircase served as a model for the architect of the Opéra Garnier in Paris, and there are twelve statues presiding over the square from atop the portico; do you recognise the 9 muses that accompany Minerva, Venus and Juno? Today, the Grand Théâtre is home to the Opéra National de Bordeaux.


4 JAUME PLENSA'S SANNA

This artistic creation by Jaume Plensa consists of a cast iron feminine figure that rises 7 metres into the air. It was placed in its impressive setting on Place de la Comédie in 2013 as part of an exhibition that included 11 of the Catalan sculptor's monumental pieces, and will stay there until 2021. It was acquired by an anonymous benefactor.

HISTORY

PILIERS DE TUTELLE

Where Place de la Comédie now lies, there was previously a Gallo-Roman temple, built in honour of Tutela, the divine protector of the city that was then known as Burdigala. The temple was torn down in 1677 under the order of Louis XIV following a riot against château Trompette, a symbol of royal power (see page 35). As a consequence, the Palais Gallien is the only remaining visible vestige of the Roman period in Bordeaux (page 49)

5 ALLÉES DE TOURNY


Redeveloped by Intendant Tourny between 1743 and 1757, originally there were only single storey buildings on just one side of the street in order to avoid the cannons from Château Trompette (see page 35). After its destruction, the buildings were made taller and construction began on the other side of the street. Until 1960, there were two fountains that bore the name of the street. Now they can be found in Quebec and in Soulas-sur-Mer!

THE CANELÉ


The 'canelé' is a famous little caramelised cake with a soft centre, flavoured with rum and vanilla. It is a symbol of Bordeaux's elegance in the art of pâtisserie. The chains Baillardran and La Toque Cuivrée both have boutiques in this area: Cours du XXX juillet and Cours de l'Intendance for the former and Place Gambetta for the latter. They are neighbours on Rue Sainte-Catherine.

MARQUIS DE TOURNY

As the Intendant of Guyenne from 1743 to 1757 (much like a "prefect" today), he undertook many significant urban projects under the orders of Louis XV, who wished to remodel the cities of France in the image of the monarchy and Versailles. Among other examples of the immense effect the Marquis de Tourny had on Bordeaux, he destroyed the ramparts, created monumental arches, paved the streets, planted the public gardens, developed the quays and completed Place Royale (now Place de la Bourse).

6 ÉGLISE NOTRE DAME AND COUR MABLY

The Notre-Dame church and Cour Mably courtyard are the only remains of the Dominican Convent which stood in this neighbourhood in the 13th century. Pierre Michel Duplessy was the architect who planned its layout as well as the facade, inspired by the Church of the Gesù in Rome. Close to the church, the Cour Mably courtyard and the Chapter House (Salle Capitulaire) are timeless places where concerts, open air screenings and exhibitions are held all year round.

HISTORY

FRANCISCO DE GOYA

In 1813, following defeat at Vitoria, the king Joseph Bonaparte was forced to flee the Spanish kingdom. Ferdinand VII then took back the throne, restoring an absolute monarchy and launching significant waves of repression. As a result, liberals fled Madrid, with many settling in Bordeaux, including the painter Francisco Goya, who lived here from 1824 until his death in 1828. A statue of his effigy, a gift from the city of Madrid, can be seen at Place du Chapelet.

GAMBETTA, HÔTEL DE VILLE, MÉRIADECK

A contemporary vision in a historic district. There are several museums in the area surrounding the Cathedral ("Saint-André") and the Palais Rohan (the town hall). The town hall's reception rooms open onto a view of Mériadeck, the business district that was constructed in a typical 1960s style.



1 PORTE DIJEAUX & PLACE GAMBETTA

A gateway into the city from the West since the Roman era (then called Jovia Gate), it was rebuilt by Voisin between 1748 and 1753. Under Louis XIV, it was called Dauphin's Gate in honour of the French Dauphin, the future King Louis XV. The arc de triomphe opens out onto Place Gambetta, marked out as the official centre of the city by a milestone in the 19th century; it still stands at number 10. Development work began in 2018 to transform "Gambetta" into a garden square. A regeneration work has placed the square into a "garden square".

Located in a house occupied by Montesquieu (see page 65), the Mollat bookshop has been a temple for literature lovers since 1896. With 15 subject sections over 2,700 m² and more than 300,000 titles, it is the largest independent bookstore in France.

3 MUSÉE DES ARTS DÉCORATIFS ET DU DESIGN

Under the antique panelling and chandeliers of the Hôtel de Lalande, designed by Etienne Laclotte in 1779, the furnishings and ornaments recreate the atmosphere of an aristocratic townhouse under Louis XVI. At the rear, a former municipal prison has just been made into an exhibition room. In parallel to the exhibitions dedicated to the decorative arts, it gives a new impetus to design and contemporary creation.

4 CATHÉDRALE SAINT-ANDRÉ

In 1096, Pope Urban II consecrated the Bordeaux's cathedral. In 1305, the Archbishop of Bordeaux, Bertrand de Goth, was elected Pope under the name of Clement V, and a period of construction followed. The design of the Saint-André cathedral was based

on the Latin Cross, and constitutes a fine example of southern gothic architecture. The Royal Door, constructed in the 13th century, is decorated with remarkable sculptures. Two famous marriages took place here: the marriage of Eleanor of Aquitaine and the future king of France, Louis VII (1137), as well as the marriage of Louis XIII to Anne of Austria (1615).

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

5 TOUR PEY-BERLAND (PEY-BERLAND TOWER)

The 12th century bell tower was unable to support the bells and house the Great Bell thus necessitating the constructions of a separate bell tower from the cathedral in 1440. It was only in 1863 that a monumental statue of Our Lady of Aquitaine was raised on top. At the top of some 231 steps and from a height of 50 metres, this is undoubtedly the finest panoramic viewing platform in the city!



6 PALAIS ROHAN

The Palais Rohan recalls the splendour and power of the archbishops of Bordeaux in the 18th century. In 1772, the archbishop Mériadeck de Rohan commissioned the architect Joseph Etienne to build him a new palace. After the Revolution, it became the District Hall, then the Prefecture of Gironde, and finally the Town Hall in 1837. Inside the building is one of the most beautiful staircases in France, considered a masterpiece of French stonemasonry.

7 FORT DU HÂ & TRIBUNAL DE GRANDE INSTANCE

In 1972, the French National School for the Judiciary became decentralised, setting up in Bordeaux. It was established on the site of the former Fort du Hâ: a fortress of which only two towers remain, built by Charles VII of France following his victory against the English.

To the east lies the School by Guillaume Gillet (1969-1972) and to the west, in extension to the courthouse, lie the silhouettes of the wooden husks of the seven outrooms of the High Court by Richard Rogers (1994-1998).

HISTORY

THE TRAMWAY

The first tram lines were laid in 1880; they consisted of carriages on rails that were pulled by horses. This mode of locomotion was used until 1990, from which time it was gradually replaced by the electric tramway.

In 1946, 38 lines were in use over 200 km. This too didn't last and was replaced by buses. The tramway finally made a welcome return in 2003.

8 MUSÉE & GALERIE DES BEAUX-ARTS CITY PASS

The museum allows visitors to take a close look at masters of European art (Matisse, Picasso, Renoir, Rubens, Véronèse...) as well as Bordeaux's native painters (André Lhote, Albert Marquet, Odilon Redon), of various periods and styles. The south wing is dedicated to classical 16th to 18th century paintings, while the north wing contains 19th and 20th century art. As an extension of the section in the north wing, the museographic part in the south wing is now home to sculptures that date from the Renaissance period to the Enlightenment, complementing the paintings already on display. The Galerie des Beaux-Arts, located opposite the gardens of the City Hall (la Mairie), hosts the museum's temporary exhibitions.

9 ÉGLISE SAINT-BRUNO

The first Baroque church built in Bordeaux, between 1611 and 1622. It is the building to have survived the destruction of the Chartreux convent in the 19th century, thanks to the fortune of a local noble who later became a Carthusian, and with the support of Cardinal François de Sourdis (Archbishop of Bordeaux from 1599 to 1628). It is all that remains of the Carthusian monastery that was destroyed in the 19th century.

SAINT-SEURIN, FONDAUDÈGE



Townhouses, parks and gardens. In this neighbourhood located between the main city centre roads (les cours) and the inner ring road (les boulevards), the old Bordeaux bourgeois ambiance still reigns. The streets are lined with typical 'Bordelais' single-storey houses (voir page 75) and large, lavish stone ones which stand harmoniously alongside the parks and gardens of this elegant neighbourhood.



1 BASILICA OF SAINT-SEURIN

As early as the 4th century, converts settled on the site of a large Gallo-Roman necropolis where they built their first chapel. In the 11th century, the canons undertook the construction of a large Romanesque building, of which the porch, the chevet, the crypt and the base of the bell tower still exist. Work continued on the building in the 19th century with the addition of several chapels and a neo-Romanesque frontage.

2 SAINT-SEURIN EARLY CHRISTIAN SITE

The archaeological site of Saint Seurin was probably the cradle of Christianity in Bordeaux back in the Gallo- Roman era. In 1910, archaeological excavations in front of the basilica revealed a vast Christian necropolis with rows of graves underground in layers, ranging from the 4th to the 18th century. Charlemagne is said to have buried his brave knights killed in the Battle of Roncevaux Pass here.

3 PALAIS GALLIEN

The Palais Gallien today constitutes the only visible remains of the Roman city of Burdigala. Built in the early 2nd century AD, its original dimensions are impressive: 130 meters long and 114 meters wide. The amphitheatre was located on the outskirts of the ancient city. Games - often cruel - were held here before large crowds. 20-25,000 people could be seated on the terraced rows of wooden benches!

4 BORDEAUX MUSEUM



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LES CHARTRONS

The Chartrons district evokes the period during which Bordeaux's trade flourished. Situated on the site of a former Chartreux convent (hence the name, Chartrons), this district was home to merchants of Anglo-Saxon, Scandinavian, German and Irish origin. They all built beautiful stone buildings which were used as warehouses and private residences.

Housed in a former warehouse for colonial goods, the Museum of Contemporary Art is dedicated to emerging contemporary work. In lieu of a permanent exhibition, this contemporary art museum commissioned the artists Christian Boltanski, Keith Haring, Richard Long and Max Neuhaus to create seven pieces in situ, all over the building. The museum's collection boasts 1600 works by 200 different artists from across the world, such as Daniel Buren, Nan Goldin, Sol LeWitt and Richard Serra.

On the museum's rooftop, the CAPC café- reconverted by Andrée Putman- hinges on furniture made by the same designer and works by the artist Richard Long.

3 TEMPLE DES CHARTRONS

Built between 1832 and 1835 for the Protestant consistory, this temple- built in the neoclassical style- has a portico at its front, supported by four Ionic columns.

4 RUE NOTRE DAME

Originally inhabited by workers in the wine industry, this semi-pedestrianised street has, little by little, seen the arrival of antique and bric-a-brac dealers and art galleries. At number 61 lies Village Notre-Dame, the largest antiques gallery in the South-West in a former print works, bringing together 35 professional antique dealers. The cafés' terrasses fill the streets when the sun is out and for the 'Fête du Vin Nouveau et de la Brocante' (Celebration of the New Wine and Flea Market).

The latter is famous for its bric-a-brac stalls, roasted chestnuts, vin bourru (new wine) and street shows. Other festive events are organised here each autumn.

SHIPWRECKS OF THE GARONNE

From the quays in Chartrons, at low tide we can see shipwrecks. These are the final vestiges of the flight of the German soldiers; when they left Bordeaux in August 1944, they decided to obstruct the estuary in order to stop the Allies from coming down the river. 204 boats were sunk and the port remained impracticable until 1949.

BASSINS À FLOT AND MARITIME BORDEAUX

While Bassins à flot is a cosmopolitan and pluralist area today, it harbours a rich naval past. In the 19th century, refineries, shipyards, wet docks and dry docks took replaced the vines and marshlands that previously lay here. Like a wave- constantly moving- the area is undergoing a transformation into a "melting port" and is now home to homes, hotels, economic activity and- more notably- exceptional cultural and leisure sites. Today, the neighbourhood boasts La Cité du Vin, the impressive Jacques Chaban-Delmas Bridge and the brand new Musée Mer Marine.

With a height of 77 metres, it stands out as the highest lift bridge in Europe! As night falls, it lights up the 'Port of the Moon' to the delight of all photographers. The pylons are lit in blue at high tide and green at low tide.







SAINT-PIERRE, SAINT-PAUL

These neighbourhoods make up Bordeaux's old town and correspond schematically to the 13th century city plan, at the time defined by imposing ramparts. The best way to explore them is by going from square to square. History-lovers adore the area's sculpted facades while food-lovers and revellers have plenty to whet their appetites in the many restaurants, cafés and bars.



1 PLACE DE LA BOURSE - STOCK EXCHANGE SQUARE

A magnificent achievement of the Enlightenment Era that symbolises Bordeaux's opening onto the River Garonne and the rest of the world. In the 18th century, the Intendant, Boucher, decided to create the Place Royale, which would finally breach the ramparts of the fortress town. Hôtel des Fermes (left wing) was

constructed by Gabriel, the chief architect of King Louis XV, and Hôtel de la Bourse (right wing) was built by his son to complete the square, along with the isolated central pavilion which definitively ruptured the defensive wall (1735-1755). At the centre stood an equestrian statue of King Louis XV, which was replaced for a short time by one of Napoleon, before the eventual installation of the 'Fountain of the Three Graces' in 1869.

2 MIROIR D'EAU - WATER MIRROR

Since the water filtered out onto the stones here in 2006, Bordeaux has had the largest water mirror in the world (3450 m² with an 800 m³ underground reservoir). The miroir d'eau lies across from Place de la Bourse, alternating between mirror and fog effects. It was created by Jean-Max Llorca as the central feature of Michel Corajoud's regeneration of the quays. The mirror is flanked by colourful gardens: the jardin des lumières.



4 MUSÉE NATIONAL DES DOUANES

Retracing the evolution of one of the oldest sectors in French administration, this museum's collection evokes the technical nature of meetings between smugglers and customs officials, as well as the evolution of customs practice, from ancient times up until the present day. Among the copied paintings and other counterfeits, you can admire an authentic Monet painting: La Cabane du Douanier.

6 UTOPIA CINEMA

If the walls that house Utopia- an arthouse cinema- could speak, they could tell you of their turbulent history; the Church of Saint Simeon was first converted into a saltpetre house after it was decommissioned in the wake of the Revolution. It then became a naval school in the 19th century before becoming a tin factory. A bicycle seller and a garage were the last tenants here before the church's final conversion into a much-loved temple to cinema. Art films, political debates and a south-facing terrace mean that the place is all the more appreciated by locals.

7 ÉGLISE SAINT-PIERRE

This building stands on the site of the former harbour of the Roman castra. Its oldest elements, including the beautiful carved gate, date from the 14th and 15th century. This church was reconstructed in the 19th century keeping some elements of the medieval church.

8 PORTE CAILHAU 🏰 CITY PASS

Built between 1493 and 1496 on the site of an old defensive gatehouse, this was the main entrance to the city from the river for almost two centuries. While it was no doubt built as a defensive structure- made clear from the portcullis and machicolations-, the Renaissance brought with it a new architectural language: mullioned windows and sculpted decorations. As for the origins of the name, Cailhau, opinions differ. Some historians claim that it is a nod to the name of an old bourgeois family who lived in the neighbourhood, others think that it is



MASCARONS

With their figures from mythology, fantastical animals and wild beasts- all rich in symbolism-, the mascarons of Bordeaux represent a break with the geometric precision of the facades and are found all across the city. Even today, there are still almost 2000!

PALAIS DE L'OMBRIÈRE

Formerly the residence of the Dukes of Aquitaine, this palace was progressively built from the end of the 11th century where the Place du Palais still lies. Louis VII and Eleanor of Aquitaine stayed here when celebrating their marriage, as did the Kings of England. On Bordeaux's return to France, the palace became the city's Parliament and its main prison. It was destroyed in 1800 after several fires.

SAINT-PIERRE, SAINT-PAUL

9 MAISON ÉCOCITOYENNE

Built on the site of the former dockers hiring hall, La Maison Écocitoyenne aims to spread awareness of sustainable development. It is a unique project in France, combining a resource centre, an exhibition space and a space for learning what changes you can make in your everyday life to live in a more ecological way. As a certified 'Tourism and Handicap' establishment, La Maison Écocitoyenne hires out specially-adapted bikes that combine with wheelchairs. Call ahead to book one.

10 PONT DE PIERRE

The first bridge built in Bordeaux - by order of Napoleon 1st - unified the two banks of the Garonne, creating a single city. Constructed between 1810 and 1822, the bridge stretches 487 metres over the river via 17 arches, a nod to the number of letters in Napoleon Bonaparte's name. Each pillar rests on 220 pine stakes. Since 2018, the bridge has been closed to general traffic and is now reserved for pedestrians, cyclists and public transport.

11 PORTE DE BOURGOGNE


One of many gates constructed in the 18th century in place of older medieval structures that had become dilapidated or obsolete. The Burgundy Gate was inspired by Roman triumphal arches and built between 1750 and 1755 by André Portier in honour of the newborn duke of Burgundy, grandson of King Louis XV.

12 PLACE FERNAND LAFARGUE & RUE SAINT JAMES

The former 'old market place' (1155), where the pillory once stood, along with Rue Saint James, constitutes one of the hip new places in Bordeaux, with many restaurants, wine bars and innovative boutiques. The street is pronounced "Saint Jame", not like in the English style. The square lies on the pilgrimage path to Compostella; Saint-James is in fact the Gascon deformation of Saint-Jacques.

13 GROSSE CLOCHE - BIG BELL

Built in the 15th century, this fortified gateway was also a prison. Young delinquents were thrown into its dungeons fitted with thick doors and stout locks. The wits joked that they were lodging at the Golden Lion Hotel, an allusion to the weather vane on the central dome representing the king of beasts, one of the symbols of the Kings of England.

THE THREE MS

The nickname given to the trio of three illustrious writers from Bordeaux.

Montaigne (1533-1592): author of Essays, magistrate in the Parliament of Bordeaux and twice mayor of the city. His family house is visible at 23-25 Rue de la Rousselle.

Montesquieu (1689-1755): an emblematic figure of the French Enlightenment, author of The Spirit of the Laws and Persian Letters. We can see the house of his wife Jeanne de Lartigue at the end of Rue Neuve, a street which is also home to the oldest house in Bordeaux (14th century).

Mauriac (1885-1970): a great French novelist of the 20th century and winner of the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1952. Born at 86 Rue du Pas-Saint-Georges.

15 ÉGLISE SAINT-PAUL (ST PAUL'S CHURCH)

In 1662, the Jesuits acquired the former mayor's residence, set up a Professed House and undertook large-scale renovation work, including the construction of the convent's chapel. The church is one of the largest built in France by the Jesuits and impresses thanks to its harmonious proportions, architectural sobriety and decorative riches.

Today, the parish church of Saint Paul- with its Roman Cross plan- is characteristic of Bordeaux in the Baroque period.

16 RUE SAINTE-CATHERINE & PROMENADE SAINTE-CATHERINE 🚶🚶🚶

Pedestrianised in 1984, this street is 1.2 km long, cutting through the city centre on a North-South axis and linking Place de la Comédie to Place de la Victoire. The northern end is dedicated to the larger high street shops such as Galeries Lafayette, whereas the southern one is more of a student haunt. Where Rue Sainte-Catherine meets Rue Saint Rémi sits La Galerie bordelaise, built in 1837. Promenade Sainte Catherine is a recently opened pedestrian area that has been developed around a central fountain, linking the new shopping area to key shopping streets. Since 2015, 35 new boutiques and restaurants have opened here.

17 MUSÉE D'AQUITAINE 🎫 CITY PASS 🚶🚶🚶

As home to Le Musée d'Aquitaine, Bordeaux possesses one of the largest regional history museums in France. Here, discover the city's history from the Prehistoric period, through Ancient times and the Middle Ages up until now, with a special emphasis placed on the 18th century: Bordeaux's golden age. Since March 2019, you can look at the city's recent history and that of the surrounding area, as well as being able to catch a glimpse of Bordeaux in 2030, all through sculptures, paintings, objects, models, and large-scale projections, making this new section particularly interactive.

SAINT-MICHEL, SAINTE-CROIX, LA VICTOIRE

These southern quarters were only integrated into the city on completion of the third wall in 1327. In former times, the convents were concentrated around here. Today, they host the largest markets in the city centre and are home to a particularly lively cosmopolitan population.



1 BASILIQUE SAINT-MICHEL

First built as a church in the flamboyant gothic style before becoming a basilica, it was built between the 14th and 16th centuries. At 75 metres long, 38 metres wide and with a central nave that is 23 metres high, it is one of the city's largest places of worship and an important place of pilgrimage. Like Saint-André cathedral (page 42), the basilica is particular in that its bell tower, "the spire of St Michel" is independent of the church. More than 35 years after they were stolen, 4 polychromatic fragments that date from the 15th century have recently been returned to their original place, in the altarpiece of Chapel of Saint Joseph. The story of their restoration is worthy of a spy novel.

2 FLECHE SAINT-MICHEL SAINT MICHEL SPIRE

A source of pride for Bordeaux, the Saint-Michel freestanding bell tower, which the people of Bordeaux call "La Flèche" (The Spire), is 114 metres high. In the underground crypt, you can watch a video projection about the Saint-Michel mummies and, for the more courageous, you can tackle the 47 metre climb to the panoramic terrace where you can enjoy an unforgettable view over the city and the river. In this spire's underground crypt, a video projection tells the unlikely story of the Mummies of Saint Michel. In 1791, 70 bodies were disinterred from the old Saint Michel Cemetery and placed in the crypt. From that point on, this macabre ring of bodies filled the pages of French Romantic writers on their travels, such as Stendhal, Hugo and Flaubert. The mummies remained until the crypt was closed in 1979.

4 PORTE DE LA MONNAIE

The smallest of the gates of Bordeaux. It was designed by Nicolas Portier and built in 1759 by the architect Jean Alary. It overlooks a street of the same name, formerly known as the Rue Anglaise as apparently only the English soldiers risked going there - leads to the elegant former Hôtel de la Monnaie.

The oldest church in Bordeaux, it is especially known for its Dom Bedos organ: a masterpiece from the 18th century. Sculptures representing avarice and lust preside over the central doorway of this former abbatial church. The tower to the left was added in the 19th century. The church opens out onto a village square, paved just like yesteryear; it's a perfect place to have a drink, shaded by plane trees. As home to the Bordeaux-Aquitaine National Theatre, school of fine arts and music academy, it's no surprise that a bohemian, artistic atmosphere reigns in this neighbourhood.

7 MARCHÉ DES DOUVES

A true jewel of 19th century metallic architecture, Le Marché des Douves was, for a long time, a lively place regardless of the season. On the eve of the Second World War, there were 124 market stalls here. Following a long period of abandon, the market was restored thanks to the neighbourhood's residents and associations. Since September 2015, it has a new vocation as headquarters for a number of non-profit associations.

9 MUSÉE D'ETHNOGRAPHIE DE L'UNIVERSITÉ DE BORDEAUX

The collections of this one-hundred-year-old museum consist of 6000 exhibition pieces collected in the late 19th century. These objects (clothing, jewellery, arts and crafts, body care items, and other linked to beliefs, etc.) are not just from Asia, but also from Africa, the Arctic, the Americas and Oceania, taking you far away from Bordeaux. In addition to these objects, the museum has a collection of 12,000 photographs, as well as temporary exhibitions.



10 PLACE DE LA VICTOIRE

At the centre of an area frequented enormously by students, in the midst of Place de la Victoire rises the porte d'Aquitaine. Built in 1753 by the architect André Portier in celebration of the birth of the Duke of Aquitaine, the frontispiece is decorated with sculptures depicting sea gods and royal arms on one side, while the other is decorated with sculptures of fruits and flowers. In the centre of the square, an obelisk reaches high into the sky beside two cast iron tortoises. The obelisk is a contemporary sculpture by Ivan Theimer, placed here in 2005 and designed as an homage to the vine and its wine.

11 SYNAGOGUE DE BORDEAUX

Built in 1878 by the architect Charles Durand for Bordeaux's Jewish consistory. It is one of the most beautiful synagogues in Europe. Perhaps because there is no clearly established model for drawing a synagogue, the architect used an eclecticism which mingled medieval art with oriental references. It is considered as one of the most beautiful synagogues in Europe.



1 LA MÉCA & LE FRAC

La Maison de l'Économie Créative et Culturelle en Nouvelle-Aquitaine (MÉCA) was inaugurated in 2019 and is home to regional cultural agencies dedicated to live performance, literature and cinema, as well as the regional contemporary art foundation, Le Fond Régional d'Art Contemporain Aquitaine (FRAC). Designed by the Danish architect Bjarke Ingels, this edifice is 37 metres tall and provides a unique panorama from its terrace. A large portion of the building has exclusively professional purposes, however the FRAC exhibitions, an outside walking space and panoramic terrace are open to the public, as well as a café-restaurant (open 6 days a week for lunch and dinner).

2 HALLE BOCA

This reinforced concrete hall was built in 1938 and housed Bordeaux's abattoirs. Destroyed in a fire in 1997, it has recently been renovated and turned into an impressive food court and space for food businesses. Its 1300 m² contain 14 food stands placed around a communal area that seats 350.

3 CHÂTEAU DESCAS

On the margins of the grand Bordeaux wine trade, Jean Descas built up his business by selling his "little wines" that he transported down the Garonne. He set up his wine warehouse on Quai de Paludate and called on the architect Alphonse Ricard to construct this surprising, extravagant building that stands in contrast to the more classical facades found along the quays. Only the wings of the building are occupied today by a cocktail bar, in addition to some associations and offices.


Historically made out of wood, the first blonde stone 'échoppes' (single-storey houses) first appeared in the 18th century. While they were originally reserved for the working class, they became bourgeois residences in the 20th century. These townhouses with decorated facades and sculpted patterns are in high demand nowadays, reaching far back from the street, often with a garden at the rear.

4 GARE SAINT-JEAN

Initially built as a provisional structure, Bordeaux-Midi was built in 1855 and rapidly became the city's main train station thanks to Eiffel's bridge, to the detriment of the Orleans station (gare d'Orléans) located on the other side of the river (see page 78). Hidden behind the large facade is a giant metallic hall - the largest in Europe - created by the Daydé and Pillé company (1898) and completely renovated, requiring 2800 tonnes of scaffolding.

5 ÉGLISE DU SACRÉ-COEUR

This church - built in the Roman-Byzantine style and an important one for pilgrims - was constructed by the architect Jean-Jules Mondet in the image of Sacré Coeur that sits atop Montmartre, Paris. The two clocks were added to the facade following the visit of the young King Alfonso XIII in September 1912.

Along the right bank, you can walk among friends or family, admire the beauty of the stone facades, play, run, sunbathe: cross the bridge... you won't be disappointed!

The Darwin ecosystem and botanical gardens, as well as the open air food and concert venues along the river, bring the right bank to life.



1 LION DE VEILHAN

Made of composite materials, this contemporary sculpture is a true visual landmark at the entrance of the Bastide district. Simplified and disproportionate, the lion resembles something between a toy, a design object and a decorative piece, challenging the conventions of sculpture.

2 GARE D'ORLÉANS

Bordeaux's first train station, it was built on the Bordeaux - Paris line in 1852 on the request of the Compagnie des Chemins de Fer d'Orléans. With the completion of the Eiffel railway bridge, it lost much of its traffic to gare Saint-Jean before closing in 1951. Nowadays, the building has been converted into a cinema and several restaurants.

3 PARC AUX ANGÉLIQUES 🧑🧒🧓

The southern part of the park (from Saint-Jean bridge to the iconic pont de pierre already offers a beautiful view of the Saint-Michel district. The area between the 'stone bridge' and Darwin has become one of the Bordeaux locals' favourite places to play and relax (picnic, bowling alley,



basketball court, etc.). The park takes its name from a rare plant species: an angelica plant that only grows in French estuaries. It is protected at both a national and European level. Several can be seen along the Garonne riverbank.

4 JARDIN BOTANIQUE

Designed by the landscaper Mosbach and the architect Jourda, these gardens provide an introduction into the world of plants, biodiversity and nature. It is divided into six landscapes, notably including the following: a gallery of regional environments and their soils and flora; a spectacular water garden with its collection of water lilies and other water plants; an arboretum and its large variety of tree leaves and bark textures; magnificent greenhouses containing Mediterranean vegetation.

5 DARWIN. CASERNE NIEL

Darwin is both a place of work and a place of relaxation. This “ecosystem” was created in an old military barracks on a 20,000 m2 wasteland, but it is now home to businesses, associations, restaurants, an organic delicatessen, a bookshop, an urban farm and the only covered skatepark in the city. Launched in 2010, Darwin is firmly at the front of Bordeaux’s green economy thanks to its recycling practices, the fact that it runs on 100% renewable energy, the fact that the toilets use rainwater, plus the permaculture vegetable patches, beehives and chicken coops. Street artists of international renown have left their mark here and many cultural activities are put on all year round. Over a thousand visitors a day pass through its gates.





9 GRANDS MOULINS DE PARIS

This monumental “cathedral of wheat”, an example of functionalist architecture, has always been a clear point of reference, made even more so by the opening of the nearby four-pyloned Chaban-Delmas bridge in 2013. The building dates between 1920 and 1921 and is composed of different parts of varying heights, interconnected over 200 metres: a foyer, stockage silos, a 43 metre-high central mill, offices and a flour shop.

To accompany the rapid development of the Bastide neighbourhood after the opening of the pont de pierre, Paul Abadie, a great figure of religious architecture, built the new church in 1884. Its slender dome, crowned by a columned turret, echoes that of the Basilica of the Sacred Heart (Sacré cœur) in Montmartre, which he also designed.

12 MAISON CANTONALE

A highly original structure inspired by medieval houses, it mixes brick with white stone in a carefully crafted design. While the exterior is more in the Art Nouveau style; the interior decoration follows the Art Deco movement. Recently renovated, today it is a venue for many association events.

13 ARKÉA ARENA







A WORLD OF CULTURES

Often seen as the flagship of Bordeaux's wine tourism, La Cité du Vin is unique, for its spectacular architecture but also for its spectacular cultural offering, which unveil the wealth and diversity across the wine-growing world. At the heart of the experience is a permanent immersive area and its 19 themed sections are spread over 3000 m². It's an invitation on a journey through time and across the world to explore wine growing civilisations, using all of the senses. Among the themed spaces are: a breathtaking flight over the most prestigious vineyards in the world via projections; a 50-seater boat equipped with a 220° screen where you can sail back in time, accompanied by wine merchants; and, a series of interactive globes for exploring how wine grows across the world. On average, the tour lasts between two and three hours and ends with a wine tasting on the 8th floor in a 360° tasting space called Le Belvédère, from which point we can admire the breadth of the city and its river. In addition to the main attractions, there is also a panoramic restaurant, a wine bar, some temporary exhibitions and a boutique, as well as several tasting workshops and conferences. For continuing your discovery into the Bordeaux vineyards, all the information you need on the Bordeaux Wine Routes can be found at the dedicated information desk.



GRAVES & SAUTERNES

To the south, heading to the birthplace of the Bordeaux vineyards and its Pessac-Leognan, Graves, Sauternes, Barsac vintages... Located on the left bank of the Garonne River, this region assembles vintages that produce wines of three colours: red, white and "gold".

MÉDOC

Known as the 'Route des Châteaux' ("The Chateau Route"), the D2 secondary road runs through the Médoc vineyards from Saint Vivien de Médoc to Eysines. Margaux, Pauillac, Saint-Julien, Saint- Estèphe... many of Bordeaux's most prestigious names, varied in architecture and stretching out over 80 kilometres.

BLAYE & BOURG

Just opposite, on the right bank of the estuary, are the family estates of Côtes de Blaye and Côtes de Bourg. Here you can find breathtaking views over the estuary, Romanesque churches, a Gallo-Roman archaeological site and enchanting little ports, as an added bonus!

SAINT ÉMILION - POMEROL - FRONSAC

Located on the right bank of the Dordogne River, Saint-Emilion, known as the hill of 1,000 wines, is famous for its fine and elegant wines, but also for its medieval city, its UNESCO World Heritage listed vineyards, its macarons, and its monolithic church carved into the rock: the largest in Europe.

ENTRE-DEUX-MERS

The largest winemaking region in Bordeaux, sometimes compared to Tuscany, produces a multitude of red, rosé, and clairet wines and a wide variety of whites.

LEFT BANK

On the horizon, the forest of the Landes de Gascogne stretches as far as the eye can see. The maritime pine forests are always close, as are the vineyards of the prestigious appellations of the Medoc and Graves. You can feel the breeze from the Atlantic Ocean, just 40 km away. This suburban territory was, in the twentieth century, the natural extension of the Bordeaux metropolis.

LES JALLES (WATERWAYS)

RÉSERVE ÉCOLOGIQUE DES BARRAILS

The largest green space that Bordeaux has to offer (156 hectares) is located in the north of the city and consists of a floral park, woodlands and the surrounding wetlands. Here you can discover exceptional biodiversity in plants, insects and birds, to say nothing of the herd of endemic Bordeaux cows.

With its artificial caves that look out onto the lake stretching over 4 hectares, its artificial ruins, its bridges and rare birds, Le Parc de Majolan offers walkers a poetic and interesting stroll among this land of rocks: an artform that was widespread during the 19th century. The park is in the process of gaining listed status and already boasts the "Remarkable Garden" label. Close to the park's car park, visit La Vacherie to meet a sheep farmer, learn about their work and enjoy cultural activities. You can also buy some of their wares!

All year long, the Écosite du Bourgailh association puts on activities and workshops to give visitors an insight into biodiversity issues and to educate about sustainable development.

CITÉ FRUGÈS-LE CORBUSIER

Built in 1926 by the famous architect Le Corbusier, Cité-Frugès is a fine example of French urban architecture. This housing estate and garden contains 50 houses and has recently been classified by UNESCO as a World Heritage site.

Beside the stream there are many mills, an animal park and a nature centre, as well as Le Prieuré de Cayac, a key site for pilgrims on the Camino de Santiago trail.

RIGHT BANK

Located between Garonne and Dordogne, the hillside of Entre-deux-Mers is an unprecedented space for walks. Further north, the landscape is dominated by vast marshlands and many winemaking chateaux.

THE SLOPES OF THE GARONNE

PARC DE L'ERMITAGE SAINTE-CATHERINE

This veritable belvedere, over 60 metres above sea level, offers spectacular views over the left bank of Bordeaux. This former quarry is one of the Parc des Coteaux: a collection of parklands on the right bank of the Garonne that stretches over more than 400 hectares.

MUSÉE DE L'ASSURANCE MALADIE

Le Musée National de l'Assurance Maladie was created in 1989 by La Caisse Primaire d'Assurance Maladie de la Gironde. The tour takes in the archives of this national health insurance museum, photographs, unusual objects and even a reconstruction of an old Sécurité Sociale welcome desk from the post-Second World War period.

PARC PALMER

Parc Palmer links the lower and higher parts of Cenon, offering contrasting landscapes and a large panorama over the Garonne. It is formed of vast, hilly prairies, tree-lined walkways, narrow trails along the hillside, an open-air amphitheatre, châteaux and the concert venue Le Rocher de Palmer. The park also boasts a play area for children, summer walkways and open-air concerts.

ÉGLISE SAINT-SIMÉON

One of the oldest churches in the Entre-deux-Mers region (12th century). From the top of a hill, the church offers a superb panorama over the Garonne. Painted murals, rich interior furnishings and a painting gallery, one of which was donated by Emperor Napoleon III: all enrich the building's decoration.

SURROUNDINGS OF BORDEAUX:

MUST-SEE SITES

Bordeaux and its hinterlands make for a unique tourist destination, with 5 major UNESCO World Heritage sites:

SAINT JACQUES DE COMPOSTELLE TRAIL

Listed in 1998

7 monuments of the region have been listed by UNESCO since 1998 under the title 'Chemins de Saint-Jacques de Compostelle': the abbey of la Sauve-Majeure and the Church of Saint Peter, Bazas Cathedral, the church of Notre Dame de la Fin des Terres and three more sites in Bordeaux: the basilicas of Saint-Michel and Saint-Seurin, as well as the cathedral (Saint Andrew's).

SAINT-EMILION JURISDICTION

Listed in 1999

In December 1999, 5400 hectares of vineyards and the 8 villages that come under the Saint-Émilion Jurisdiction were listed as World Humanity Heritage sites in the 'cultural landscapes' category. It was the first winegrowing region in the world to receive this honour.

BORDEAUX. PORT OF THE MOON

Listed in 2007

It has been 10 years since an urban perimeter of 1810 hectares in central Bordeaux received recognition by UNESCO as a World Heritage site. This area, known as the 'Port de la Lune' ("Port of the Moon"), takes in almost all of the city centre.

VERROU VAUBAN

Listed in 2008

The Blaye Citadel, Fort Pâté and Fort Médoc were also listed as UNESCO World Heritage sites, as well as eleven other Major Vauban Sites. This is in recognition of the exceptional work of one man, Vauban, who was an engineer in the service of King Louis XIV.

CITÉ FRUGES-LE CORBUSIER

Listed in 2016

The 40th session of the UNESCO World Heritage Committee saw the architectural works of Le Corbusier join the list of recognised sites. Among the 17 listed sites is the 'Cité Frugès' of Pessac, a work that was representative of the Modern Movement, ordered by the industrial sugar producer Henri Frugès.
